Three Gums is pretty and flowery garden, crammed with colourful roses and perennials, with a box hedge lining the path leading to the door of the home

On the boundaries, hedges and trees create a backdrop to a series of large clipped domes of rosemary interspersed with frothy clumps of seaside daisy which cascade over and soften the stone walls that retain the slight slope of the land. Crepe myrtles, roses, westringia, russelia and perennials add bright splashes of colour.

Three massive old river red gums tower over the side garden and here a path winds through a mix of natives and hardy climate compatible plants, past a tiny pond and sitting area.

There will be plant sales and morning and afternoon tea will be served to the visitors.

COMMONWEALTH HEADS OF GOVERNMENT MEETING (CHOGM) 2024 TO BE HELD IN SAMOA

Samoa, a proud member of the Commonwealth, is honoured to announce that it will host the 2024 Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) in October 2024 on the theme "One Resilient Common Future: Transforming our Common Wealth". Samoa, the first Small Island Developing State from the Blue Pacific to host CHOGM, will bring a unique perspective to the table. CHOGM 2024 promises to be a landmark event, uniting Commonwealth nations in their pursuit of resilience, sustainability, and a shared future. The fa'asamoa, or Samoan way of life, exemplifies collective responsibility, encapsulating values such as respect, dignity, love, protection, and service. This ethos aligns with the principles of the Commonwealth Charter, uniting the Commonwealth Aiga (family) of 56 nations, representing one-third of the global population. These nations, diverse in size and development status, share common beliefs and values, where every member's contribution is significant.

THE QUEEN'S COMMONWEALTH CANOPY CLELAND NATIONAL PARK RECOGNISED 20 NOVEMBER 2023

The Royal Commonwealth Society, SA Branch, along with Professor Chris Daniels, were instrumental in firstly, getting Cleland National Park recognised as a worthy inclusion, and secondly making it happen! Eight years hard work came to its conclusion with RCS Council Members attending an afternoon reception, held at Mt Lofty Summit in the presence of Her Excellency, Frances Adamson AC, Mr Rod Bunton, Miss Sophie Bunton, and numerous other invited guests.

It was a warm, clear day, and the view was sensational. In the absence of much shade, the speeches were kept to a minimum, prior to afternoon tea being served, and photo opportunities were made the most of! The sound of the wind in the trees, and the ever present bird song made a very appropriate background to what is, without doubt, one of the RCS greatest achievements to date.

The following is taken directly from the Cleland Website, and while the RCS are not mentioned, we can all quietly reflect on a job well done!

20 November 2023 Cleland National Park was added to the Queen's Commonwealth Canopy (QCC) - a network of forest conservation projects throughout the Commonwealth of Nations' 56 member countries.

Cleland Wildlife Park sits within the national park. The national park is just the third QCC inclusion in Australia, alongside Bulburin National Park in Queensland and the ancient rainforests of K'gari (Fraser Island), since the program started in 2015.

The aim of the initiative is to combine knowledge on how best to preserve forests, while providing accreditation to sustainable forestry schemes within the Commonwealth.

Cleland is the final site accepted into the QCC as the program is being discontinued after the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in September 2022.

Matthew Neuhaus

Matthew Neuhaus was a career diplomat with the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) He spent much of his childhood (1960-1974) in the central region of Tanzania where his parents worked as Anglican Missionaries.

Matthew completed a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) and a Bachelor of Laws at the University of Sydney (1976–81). He later completed a Masters of Philosophy in International Relations at the University of Cambridge(1985–86).

In June 2006, he attended the Harvard University Kennedy School Leaders in Development Program, and was a visiting fellow at the University of Cambridge in 1994 and 2015.

He joined the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs in 1982 and has held posts both overseas and in Australia.

His most recent appointment in 2018 was as the Australian Ambassador to the EU.

The South Australian Branch of the RCS has invited Matthew and his wife, Angela, to SA and so come and hear and meet Matthew at the lunch to celebrate the Commonwealth.

Rediscovering Adelaide continued

TOUR OF GOVERNMENT HOUSE Thursday March 21 10.30am

Government House, Adelaide is not only the oldest public building in South Australia, but it is also the oldest Government House in Australia.

Initially the two-storey Government House consisted of 12 rooms, including what is now the Queen Elizabeth II Room, the Large Drawing Room, Small Dining Room and three upstairs bedrooms. From 1855 to 1856, Government House was doubled in size with a two-storey addition to the southwest. The Italianate extension included a portico which became the official main entrance, the State Entrance, Small Drawing Room, State Dining Room, Adelaide Room and Ballroom. In 1901, a commemorative alcove with 10 emblematic stained-glass windows, known as the Federation Windows, was installed in the ballroom. Commissioned by the Right Honourable Hallam Tennyson, the 14th Governor of South Australia, the windows marked the visit of the Duke and Duchess of York to Australia for the opening of the first Australian Parliament.
